PHONE SNOOPING

How Millennial's Spy on Their Partner's Phone

You have to be pretty strong-minded to not sneak a peek at your other half's phone if the chance is presented. Our survey highlights that it is, in fact, men that come off the most untrustworthy when it comes to checking their partners phones without permission and knowing their passcode. This is despite a higher number of women being happier to hand over their phone if asked, further more women were more likely to actually find something incriminating. Below are some of the key findings in the survey...

Who are the worst culprits when it comes to phone snooping?

- 68% of men have snooped on their partner's phone, compared to 47% of women
- 38% of men phone snoop without permission, compared to 24% of women

If asked by their partner, would they let them check their phone freely?

- 9 out of 10 women happy to let their partner look through their phone if they asked
- 5 out of 6 men are comfortable letting their partner look through their phone

Who knew their spouse's phone passcode?

- 1 in 2 men know how to get into their partner's phone and snoop
- 1 in 3 women know their partner's phone passcode

What is the core reasoning behind checking their partner's phone?

- 89% of men are looking for signs of cheating when snooping their partner's phone
- 70% of women are snooping their partner's phone for traces of betrayal
- 30% of women are simply snooping to be nosy

Where on the phone do they direct their investigation?

- 2 in 3 people go straight for WhatsApp when snooping their partners phone

- 46% of men snoop their partners Facebook or Instagram, compared to 29% of women
- 1 in 3 men check their partner's photo albums for incriminating evidence

Did they find anything? Was this breach of trust worth it?

- Almost half of the couples surveyed have found something incriminating on a partners phone

Would you break up with someone for snooping on your phone?

- 1 in 4 men would break up with someone for snooping on their phone
- 1 in 6 women would break up with someone for snooping on their phone

Have you ever broken up with someone because of something you found on their phone?

- 1 in 4 people had a fight or broke up because of something on their partner's phone
- 1 in 10 guys have broken up with their partner after finding something they didn't like on their phone

How does this behavior correlate to social media snooping?

- 27% of men regularly snoop on their partner's social accounts, almost double the responses of women
- 62% of men have snooped on their partner's social media accounts
- 56% of women have snooped on their partner's social media accounts
